

Putting your task bar back to the bottom after it goes for a walk

(Windows 98, ME, 2000, XP)

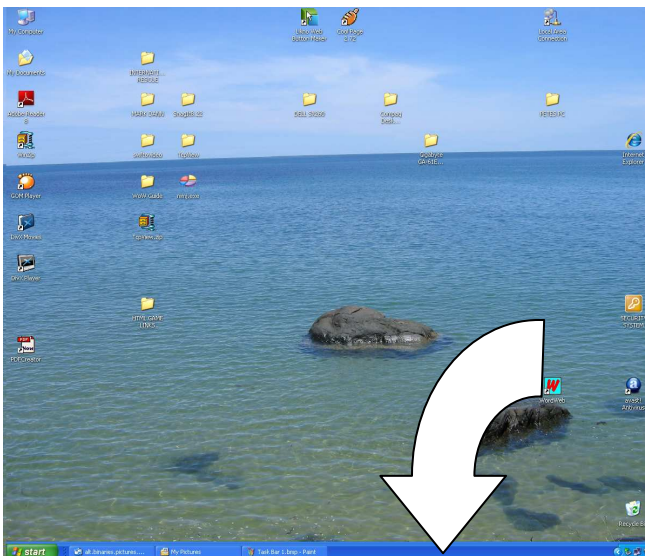
Place your mouse pointer onto the centre of the middle of the task bar.



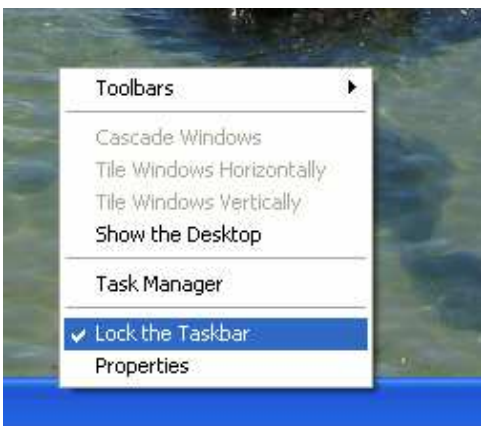
Click and hold the LEFT button down.

Swing the Task bar back to the bottom of the screen in a 45 Degree arc to the left.

(or from where ever it has 'walked' to. If it is at the top, you will have to arc to the side first, then swing to the bottom)



It may take a few attempts, but it will go back into place eventually.



To prevent your task bar going 'walking' around your desktop again, you should lock it into place using the 'Lock the taskbar' option found by a single [RIGHT] click on the taskbar when you have it back in place.

(Add a tick to the option with the [LEFT] mouse button)
